



ERASMUS+ KA210-SCH: Small-scale partnerships in school education «Habits on Purpose: Environment» 2023-1-FR01-SCH-000157602

HOPE Erasmus+ Project

The project has 3 partners: OGEC des écoles du Bon Sauveur from France-coordinator, Colegiul National Gheorghe Vranceanu from Romania and IES INFANTA ELENA from Spain.

The project's objectives are:

- 1. raise awareness of the environmental crisis
- 2. educate on protecting the environment and on sustainability
- 3. create daily habits for a healthy, sustainable and green life (in school and in daily life)
- 4. create an ecological digital conscience
- 5. integrate disadvantaged categories in the project activities (economic problems, migrants)
- 6. learn about different European cultures and about our common European identity (common beliefs, habits, ideas, principles)

We will carry out activities to raise awareness, educate and create a conscience that will change the behavior of the participants and, using our final products, of other people (students, teachers, local community members)

Our outcomes:

- -an ecological conscience (including a digital ecological conscience)-measured by observation and comparing initial questionnaires to final ones
- -changed behavior concerning environmental protection and a sustainable healthy life: 10 daily habits at home, at school, and in our free time-measured by observation and by analyzing the filling in a "green journal" by the participants
- -improved digital skills-by using modern technology in sustainable way-in online meetings on eTwinning, in posts on communication platforms etc-measured by the teachers who observe the behavior of the students
- -improved linguistic competences-all the communication will be in English and we will learn the basics in each participant's language; we will measure the improvement by observing the communication during the project.

Our results:

- -The decalogue of a healthy and sustainable life: Ten daily habits for a green life
- -one project webpage on eTwinning
- -Posters for promoting green habitts

The target groups of our project are the teachers (aprox.100) and students from the three participant schools, 15-16 years old-approx.600 students. We aim that 25% of the participants will be from disadvantaged categories (economic obstacles, migrants, or disabilities).

The direct participants will be 18 students from each country and the teacher's team (4 teachers from each country)

We plan to extend the project results to all students in our schools (approx 2500), to their parents (aprox.5000 persons) and to the local community as the result of the dissemination activities.
